

Cedar Creek High School Counseling Department JUNIOR CHECKLIST

TSIA (Texas Success Initiative):

- If you are an incoming college student in Texas (includes Dual Credit courses at the high school), you are required to take the Texas Success Initiative Assessment (TSIA) unless you are already exempt to determine your readiness for college-level work. To determine if you are exempt, in need of the TSI assessment, or for more information, stop by the College & Career Center.
- TSIA test dates for this year will be held on:

November 1st December 10th February 10th March 25th

You will need to complete the TSIA pre-assessment prior to testing. To do so, sign up for one or the above test dates on the CCHS Website or scan the code below.



COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS:

SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test)/ACT (American College Testing)/

COLLEGE RESEARCH & COLLEGE VISITS

Research colleges and universities during your junior year and the summer before your senior year. Try to visit

• Juniors and Seniors are allowed 2 visits each year. To get absences excused, students must turn in a form letter from the institution or the CCHS College Visit form (obtained from the attendance office). Turn in the form to our attendance clerk, Mrs. Lum.

COLLEGE APPLICATION WEBSITES:

- Work on essays over the summer. Have them proofread.
- Apply to 3-4 institutions (Reach/Want/Assured)
- Be ready to submit your application on August 1.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION:

Always request your letter at least 2 weeks in advance. Pick up and fill out a template to give to your recommender. Templates are available in the College & Career Center.

GRADES IN SCHOOL:

- Sixth semester grades count. Colleges look at your ranking at the end of six semesters (last semester of Junior year).
- The summer rank does not include any summer, 2023 grades. It is also the rank that will be used for your college applications.
- If you are in the Top 10 Percent of your class at the end of the 6th semester, you qualify for automatic admittance to any Texas public university or college (except for UT Austin, which is top 6 percent).

NCAA: NCAA Eligibility Center

- If you are considering participating in college athletics, you must register with the NCAA Clearinghouse.
- Complete the form and pay the fee by credit card, unless you qualify for a *fee waiver.
- Be sure to request a transcript to be sent to them the following 4 times: when you register, at the end of your Junior year (6th semester), after the first semester of your Senior year, and a final transcript.
