# Superintendent's Charge

Create a structure for returning students and staff to our buildings that can be implemented in a short term, be nimble enough to adapt to a dynamic public health situation, and address students' academic and social/emotional needs.



### **CHALLENGES & QUESTIONS**



- Reasonably keep students and staff safe?
- Handle larger gatherings like drop off, pick up, meal time?
- Deliver high-quality, rigorous instruction, whether in-person or online?
- Determine who should come to school and who can learn at home?
- Make online content accessible (devices/internet)?
- Address students' social/emotional/mental health needs?
- Create a realistic response plan for positive cases and exposure cases for students and staff?
- Get students to/from school and extracurricular activities if social distancing limitations exist?
- Determine learning loss and remediate it ("COVID Slide")?




- Deal with potentially low student attendance and related funding?
- Plan for rolling periods of district or school closure (short term of 2-5 days to longer term 14 days or longer)?
- Manage the cleaning/disinfecting protocols, procedures and procurement of all necessary supplies and potential PPE?
- Handle employment issues for staff who don't want to/refuse to come to work even though their job duties require it?
- Address employment issues for staff in a higher at risk category?
- Determine which staff teach in-person or virtually?
- Deal with the impact of COVID on state accountability ratings of our schools?

## **Other Questions to Address**

- Will we require students and staff to wear masks?
- Will we require students and staff to wear masks at some times or in some locations? If so, what are those times and locations?
- Will wearing masks effectively eliminate athletics, band, choir, etc. from secondary programming?
- What will enforcement look like on PPE, and what hardship will that be on administrators and teachers managing campus operations? What will the consequence be of students refusing to wear a mask?
- What implications exist for UIL participation for those students who are doing 100% online classes? Will these students practice and compete?
- What implications exist for UIL regarding bus transportation, equipment use, etc.?
- What implications exist for UIL with districts under different rules?



### Instructional Options Defined by TEA

- On Campus Instruction: Traditional school model with students on campus each day as usual.
- Remote Synchronous Instruction: Two-way, real-time/live, virtual instruction between teachers and students when students are not on campus. The required amount of instructional time is scheduled each day.
- Remote Asynchronous Instruction: Instruction that does not require having the instructor and student engaged at the same time. Students learn from instruction that is not necessarily being delivered in-person or in real time. May include pre-recorded video lessons, game-based learning tasks that students complete on their own, and pre-assigned work and formative assessments made available to students on paper.

### Instructional Options Funded by TEA

#### On Campus Instruction

- 100% on campus
- Regular school day
- Funding is measured by daily attendance
- Available for grades PK-12

Remote Synchronous Instruction

- 100% online
- 2-way, real-time/live teacher & student interaction
- Funding is measured by 180 daily minutes for students in grades 3-5 or 240 daily minutes for students in grades 6-12
- Available for grades 3-12 only

#### Remote Asynchronous Instruction

- 100% online
- Recorded lessons, online resources, or live interaction
- Student and teacher are not necessarily online at same time
- Funding measured by DAILY student progress, DAILY teacher/student interaction, or DAILY completed assignments
- Available for grades PK-12 14
