District Staff & Other **Presentations**

CFO Sandra Callahan presided over a public hearing and presentation on the budget. We are excited to announce compensation increases:

- Teachers and library media specialists with more than 5 years experience 5%
- Teachers with 5 years or less experience 4.5%
- Counselors, nurses, paraprofessionals and support staff 5% of the midpoint
- Administrators 4% of the midpoint
- Employer contribution for health insurance moves from \$325/month to \$380/month, which is an additional \$660 per year in direct benefit compensation
- Bilingual-certified stipend increases move from \$4,500 to \$6,000 per year
- Starting salary for new teachers moves from \$46,300 to \$48,200

Dr. Laila Olivarez presided over a public hearing related to the report on the 2018-2019 <u>Optional Flexible School Day Program</u> as well as the application for the 2019-2020 school year. Other reports included:

- Annual SHAC Report for 2018-19
- Highlights from Library Services for 2018-19
- Annual Bilingual ESL Program for 2018-19
- <u>Parent and Student Surveys</u> completed in April and May of this year. Principals have received the comprehensive individual campus reports and will be sharing with staff.

In other presentations, the Central Appraisal District Chief Appraiser Faun Cullens shared that taxable values for 2019 are \$4,555,201,664 as of June 17, which represents a 11.70% increase from 2018. The CAD's short-term goal is to visit properties every three years. The Executive Director of Communities in Schools, Suki Steinhauser, presented on the Partnership between CIS and BISD beginning in 2019-20 to put a highly-trained, master social worker on each elementary campus. We anticipate this partnership will have profound impact on our students and families and will help us amplify our Social Emotional Learning initiative and existing programs and resources in Bastrop ISD.

Board **Action**

In addition to the consent agenda, the board approved the <u>2019-2020 Compensation Package</u> and adopted the 2019-2020 General Fund, Debt Service, and Food Service budgets. They also approved the district's application for Optional Flexible School Day for 2019-2020.
